INTERNATIONAL REPRESENTATIVE REPORT

First, I would like to say that I have some pretty big shoes to fill, as Brian Gadd did an excellent job representing our conference for the last 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ years. I hope I can live up to the expectations. We should



all remember why we became members of this organization, to ride motorcycles with likeminded people, get back to the basics and have fun.

NE II exceeded my expectations when they hosted the MWRC Fall Conference and celebrated their 20th anniversary. It was the best MWRC Conference that I have ever attended. Founding Father Chuck Shuman's speech about the history of the Blue Knights and the need to recruit young members was something that every Blue Knight should hear. He is a class act and was a special treat for everyone.

There have been two Board of Directors (BOD) meetings that I have represented you at since taking this position. On September 25th, there was a Special BOD meeting where it was decided to eliminate the position of Executive Director and replace it with Office Manager. Bessie Small is no longer employed by the Blue Knights and Jana Clark was appointed Interim Office Manager.

On October 15th, the BOD met again. Headquarters Committee Chairman Bob Flanagan, requested approval to increase the rent on our commercial rental property from \$2,600 a month to \$2,800 a month for the upcoming 2 year rental contract. It was approved unanimously. Treasurer John Gordon reported that they are working to improve the business practices and already have instituted new procedures. He also advised that the Budget Committee will have a proposed 2017 budget prepared for the December meeting. Vice President Jerry Bryan advised we currently have 18,600 members in 628 chapters. Office Manager Jana Clark advised that the renewal packets are in the mail. Currently, Jana is the only one in the office so please be patient with her. They are in the process of trying to hire another employee. Board of Governor's (BOG) Chairman Rory MacConnell reported there have been 9 payouts from the Special Fund this year. He asked that all chapters donate to the Special Fund.

There was a motion to spend up to \$20,000 dollars for a Forensic Audit of the International's Accounts and if it costs more the Executive Board is required to bring it back to the BOD. The motion passed unanimously.

Proposal 2016-0010 – Donate \$500 to the UK Nephrotic Syndrome Trust through the United Kingdom and Ireland Conference. The motion passed unanimously.

Proposal 2016-0011 – Donate \$500 to the Renal Unit of Newcastle Royal Victoria Hospital through the United Kingdom and Ireland Conference. The motion passed unanimously.

Proposal 2016-0012 – Add a section to the New Proposal Form that would require that an estimate of cost be provided by the person, group, or conference making the proposal. The motion passed unanimously.

Proposal 2016-0013 – Place former member Steve Sanders of NC XVIII and NC II on the Persona Non Grata list. The motion passed unanimously.

Under Good of the Order BOG Rory MacConnell spoke about the International Building Fundraiser. The fundraiser started on June 21st, 2016 and will end on July 1st, 2017. The contributors will be recognized.

The Donation Tiers Are As Follows, In US Dollars Only:

COPPER - \$100.00 BRONZE - \$250.00 SILVER - \$500.00 GOLD - \$750.00 PLATINUM - \$1,000.00 PLATINUM PLUS any amount over \$1,100.00.

In addition to the aforementioned I attended the Fall Southern Regional Conference in Lafayette, LA and represented the MWRC there. LA XIV did a great job.

A starter packet was sent to Ottawa County, OK after it was determined that it did not interfere with any other chapter's recruiting area. State Rep Dave McDermott and Vice Chairman Ken Delano were provided the contact information to offer assistance.
